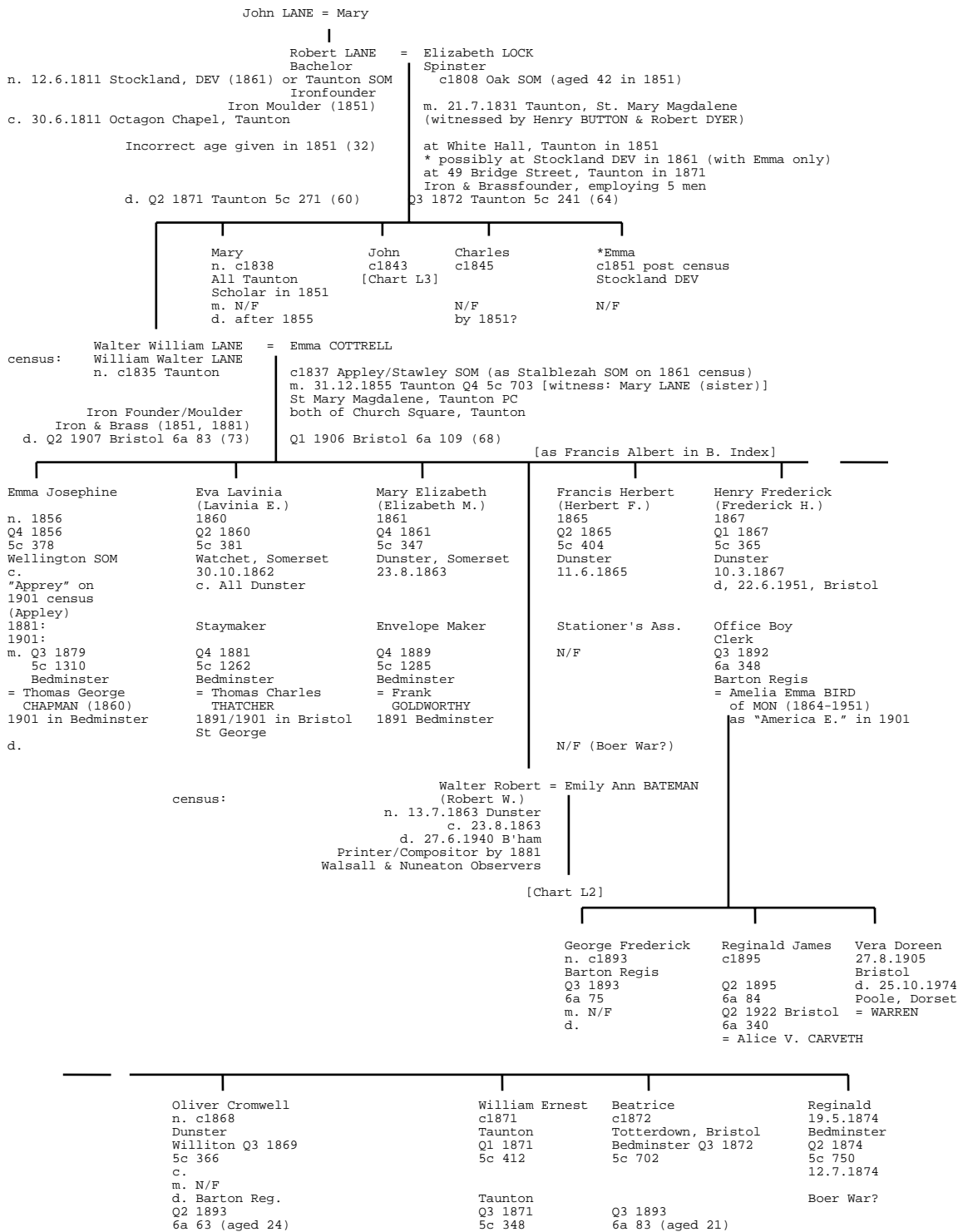


LANE Family of Somerset, Plymouth & Bristol

CHART L1: Descendants of Robert LANE & Mary (Taunton, Wellington, Watchet, Dunster, SOM & Totterdown, Bedminster, Bristol: Early - Late C19th)

Robert is most likely not the s/o Robert & Hannah c. 3.3.1813 Taunton (see separate proven descent), but is the s/o John & Mary n. 12.6.1811, c. 30.6.1811 Octagon Chapel & The Temple - Wesleyan, Taunton
 A John LANE = Mary PHILPOTT 06 Oct 1801 and another = Mary OXENHAM 22 Sep 1808 at Taunton St Mary's
 Possible sibling William c. 6.10.1809 at Paul Street Independent, Taunton.

*Only Alice to fit 1870 birth is Tiverton 5b 401 but Q4 (may be late registration). Only on 1871 census.

1861 in Dunster (High St - location unreadable)

1871 census at 7 St James's Court, St James Street, Taunton; Emma (wife of Iron Founder), Emma (Pupil teacher), Eva & Mary (Scholars) - family continues on next page (missing). Walter who was lodging in Yeovil with a Mary HEXT.

1881 census at 11 Mount Pleasant Terrace, Bedminster

1891 census at 7 Moorfields Road (mis-indexed under family at no. 6 - WHITFORD) Emma 53, Henry 24, Oliver 22, Beatrice 18, and Reginald 16.

Emma Josephine started as a pupil/teacher and later became a teacher at a private ladies school. Her husband Thomas George Chapman was a teacher/schoolmaster at elementary school. Thomas was born at Newport Pagnell, Bucks.

Both Francis H & Reginald possible family deaths in Boer War (family stories). In 1891 Francis already in barracks, Reginald not on 1901 census. Death indices not clear but an F (Pvt 4437) & R (Pvt 5052) LANE is listed as casualties of the Devonshire Regiment. Full names not given.
24801 Sapper F. Lane, 38th Field Company, Royal Engineers. Killed in action at Paardeberg 18.2.1900. His QSA medal (with Relief of Kimberley and Paardeberg clasps) was sent to his father after the war on 27.8.1903. Father's name no given.
5052 Private R. Lane, 1st Bn Devonshire Regt. Died of disease at Lydenburg on 1.3.1901

In 1891 Francis Herbert LANE, Single, 25, Private, Ordnance Store Corps
The vast majority of soldiers in census are down as from the 1st Bn. Yorkshire Regiment, senior officer William Graham Waugh

Important Note: the LANE family can have the order of their first names reversed in census returns compared to official birth registry and documents, which can cause confusion when searching for them, for e.g. the 1881 census.

Family in Watchet by 1860 and at Dunster by 1861, Taunton (1870/71), Totterdown, Bristol by 1872 & Bedminster by 1874 for the 1881 census. The family remained in the area at least until 1901.

1861 census at Dunster: Walter W (26), Emma (23), Emma J (4), Eva L (1)

1871 census at Taunton: no Walter - Emma (33), Emma J (14), Eva L (11), Mary E (9), Walter R (7), Francis H (5), Henry F (4), Alice O (2), William E (3m). Walter W was lodging in Yeovil, c/o PARKER family.

1881 census at 11 Mount Pleasant Terrace, Bedminster: William W (46), Emma (43), Lavinia E (21), Elizabeth M (19), Robert W (17), Herbert F (15), Frederick H (14), Oliver Cromwell (12), Beatrice (8), Reginald (6)

1891 census at 7 Moorfields Rd, St George's - Index error under WHITFORD but LANE on original: Emma (53), Henry F (24), Oliver C (22) Beatrice (18) Reginald (16). Walter is missing, hence confusion. Others not at home: Henry F. & William E.

1891: Francis H at Portsea, Hants at the Anglesea Barracks.

1901 census at 31 Church Road, St Matthews, Easton, Bristol: Walter W LANE (66) & Emma (63) Walter was an Ironfounder and an employer based at home.

Henry F. LANE (34) & Amelia (37) at 13 Raglan Road, Horfield, Bristol. Henry was a clerk to Sack Hiring Company. Two boys George (7) and Reginald (5).

Walter R. & Emily (both 37) already at 90 Rutter Street, Walsall.

TAUNTON DEANE EXTRACTS, RECORDS FROM TAUNTON, ENGLAND

"April 3, 1652, Thomas Trowbridge of Taunton, gent., was admitted to a parcel of land late of the waste of the lord, lying behind the stable of the castle of Taunton and near the west gate of the said castle, containing three daynes of land and one little parcel of land lying near the river of Tone and the pond of the castle called the Mote, extending from the water gate to the said parcel of land behind the stable, containing four daynes of land in the tithing of Hull, sometime the land of William Hill and late of John Trowbridge, deceased, by surrender of John Lane. (the surrender to Lane, made by John Trowbridge in 1649, was a mortgage to secure 43 pounds 4s)"

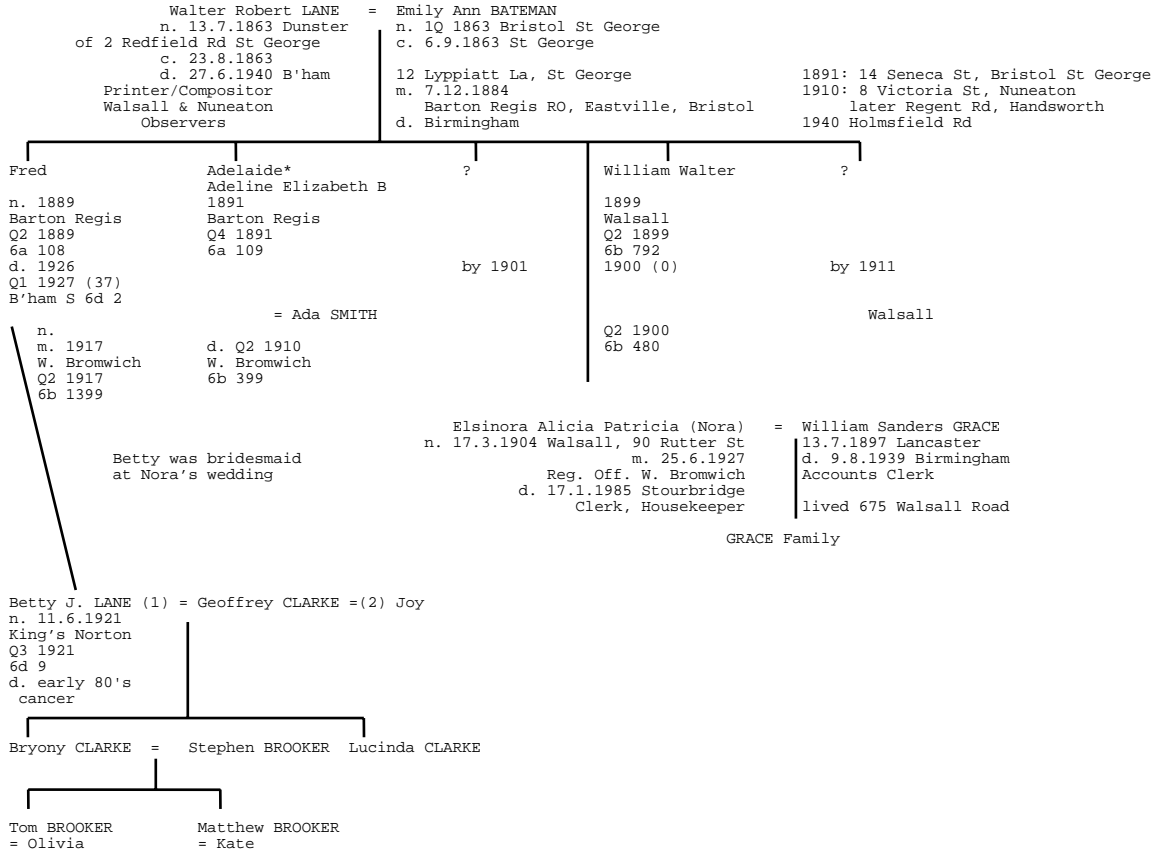

Walter Robert LANE

- Possibly six children, four of which died. A son and Nora surviving childhood. A photo reveals at least 3 daughters and 2 sons.
- 1901 only children were Fred (11) & Adelaide (9)
- 1891 only Fred - with Walter as Walter A.
- In 1911, Walter Robert (A newspaper advertisement canvasser) is a boarder in the LAKIN household at 8 Victoria Street, Chilvers Coton, Nuneaton.
- In 1911, Emily Ann and the 2 surviving children Fred (21, Assistant in Woollen Dept) & Nora (7) were at 74 Regent Road, Handsworth. Two boarders were Susannah NORTON & Percy ABBOTTS.

- He was a bit of a showman and poseur as revealed in photographs, and was very much a ladies man. He was alleged to have several illegitimate children and affairs, which gave rise to Nora's "anti-sex" attitudes. He received many letters from "well wishers" after returning from newspaper business. No such children have been identified where Walter may be given as the father.

- In later life was very much against the "Demon Drink", but was often found in the gutter by neighbours before his reformed character.

Family Story:

William Henry CLEMENTS did not like it in the Royal Marines and as soon as he could afford it bought himself out and joined the Police Force [Police Constable Devon County No 130]. He married Florence Elena LANE [although her father was unhappy about it] and they had 2 daughters Florence Emma 14.12.1892 [GGM to Alison CORNELIUS] and Fanny Elizabeth 1897, both born Kingsteignton, Devon. In 1901 William was the village Policeman in Widecombe-in-the-moor Dartmoor, later moving to Pyworthy Devon, and then North Petherwin, which used to be in Devon but is now in Cornwall due to moving of county border. Florence Emma CLEMENTS married blacksmith William Henry LAKEMAN.

He was born 1838 in Lake Street, Toxteth Park, Liverpool (Source: Baptism Record.), and buried in Toxteth Park Cemetery, Liverpool.
